VTA calls for better intermodal connectivity

VTA CEO Peter Anderson used his opening remarks to Port Outlook 2018 to reiterate the need for better intermodal connectivity to capitalise on economic prosperity generated from the ports. Around 120 delegates attended the seminar where they heard interesting addresses from leading stakeholders from the state's ports and channels stakeholders. A common theme discussed was the need for road, rail and sea freight operators and port authorities to work co-operatively together to service the growing freight task and population. MEGATRANS offers sneak peak of EWD concepts

Technology companies offered a sneak peak of Electronic Work Diary concepts to attendees of MEGATRANS2018 in Melbourne last week. The National Heavy Vehicle Regulator invited seven of the 32 technology providers that have registered a Notice of Intent to develop EWDs to discuss and present their products. The NHVR will accept applications for EWD approvals from 28 May, bringing true paperless fatigue management a step closer. NTC glimpse of future HV regulation

Automated systems, increases in on-demand and shared mobility solutions, and consumers' appetite for convenience are factors that freight and transport operators will need to adjust their business models to accommodate, according to National Transport Commission CEO Paul Retter. Mr Retter was addressing an ARTSA summit in Melbourne about the significant change freight and logistics operators will face over the next decade, which will also require changes to government rules and regulations. Planning for automation is a major focus for the NTC, which has prompted it to seek feedback on a safety assurance system for automated vehicles. Feedback on the NTC's Consultation Regulation Impact Statement (RIS) can be made online on the NTC website until Monday 9 July.
